




How parents participated in lessons.

We improved the quality of the Omama Program

Steps of career development

An improved system of omamas' career development allows the increase of their income and their professional growth. Omama in training is recruited for ¾ part-time. After reaching the program's requirements – a specific number of completed lessons and parent clubs, a written and a practical exam, she is offered a full-time position in the Junior role. After completing a similar process, she can later reach a Senior or an Expert level. With each new level, the omama gets more competencies, such as lecturing at training sessions or the development of new omamas, and her salary is also increased. Last year, three omamas became Juniors, and there are currently ten omamas holding this position.





Support for omamas

During training sessions, omamas acquire new knowledge and skills. Learning how to handle a baby correctly or how to work on a child's speech development requires support. Since last year, that support has been provided by four regional supervisors. They meet omamas two or three times a month and provide feedback. Evaluation (preparedness for lessons, parental involvement, responsive commenting) is written down in the omama application. Omama and her mentor can later return to that evaluation report and work on necessary improvements. Thanks to a very supportive approach, omamas have learned to see these meetings as a safe space for their advancement.

Supervisor training

We continually strive to improve the quality of our work, and thus, we invest in the education of not only our omamas and mentors but also supervisors. In April, all supervisors met for a two-day training where they created a standardized supervisor checklist. Under the guidance of lecturers from Play Wisely, they learned how to teach omamas to work with Play wisely cards, trained how to give constructive feedback and how to talk with omamas about neurodevelopment. The training was expanded to include the correct manipulation of a baby with a physiotherapist. A speech therapist from the Institute of Child Speech introduced strategies for speech development support.





Regional coordinators

The increase in the number of omamas and mentors in the program naturally led to the decision to strengthen our regional structures. Beginning last year, we have employed four regional coordinators for Spiš, Banská Bystrica, Košice, and Prešov regions. Their role is to be the first point of contact for people in the field, provide logistical and expert support, work on developing relations with other local organizations and institutions, and help recruit new communities and omamas. Their primary goal is to maintain equal values, humanity, and an open environment amongst us so that we can strive as a team.



From the Omama Program to kindergarten



Jana Petalíková

principal of kindergarten at Muránska Dlhá Lúka

"I see a significant benefit of the Omama Program. The children who attended the lessons with omama Ivetka are more confident and are used to working on similar tasks. Their motor skills are better, and their language skills are better for sure. Also, thanks to this, I realized that when children from Roma settlements do not respond as expected, it does not mean that they are bad, but that they might not have understood me. It is very different to work with omamas' children who understand me. Always when I need to show the children something, it is the children who Ivetka worked with who respond the first. And they inspire others. They understand the instructions the first time around. And I see great progress in those children who continue to attend kindergarten regularly and dutifully. I was very proud that I would send the best-prepared generation to school. Unfortunately, the coronavirus pandemic complicated matters and caused interruptions. Despite that, I still feel that those children are better prepared for life. It is very different from when they did not meet with omama or attend preschool regularly."

"I try to do my best to prepare my omama children and their moms as well as possible for their first big step into the big world. The teacher in the kindergarten immediately noticed the difference between the children who were in our program and those who did not have targeted guidance. Moms were also very proud of their children. The feeling I had was indescribably good."

About secure attachment

Alenka Molčanová

(social worker, OZ Návrat)

"The childhood experiences with a child's attachment figures are instrumental in their future well-being. If a child experiences instability, unpredictability, or even danger, the result is a development of insecure attachment, which can manifest in anxious, avoidant, or ambivalent behavior. With more severe threats, it can result in disorganization. That manifests in a form of the inability to have functional relationships or the inability to understand oneself or others. If this happens, it is unfortunate for the child and the people around them. In contrast, if a child is raised in an accepting and safe relationship, that child develops secure attachments. This child is then able to have healthy relationships, as well as to have healthy and expected behavior patterns, and can express her own emotions or accept the feelings of others."





About speech development

Oľga Tokárová

(speech therapist, Institute of Child Speech)

"Speech development is closely connected with cognitive development. If we can catch and support child speech development at a very early age, we build pathways for successful reading, learning, and education as such. The speech also affects a child's relationship with her social environment, friends, family, and school. At meetings with omamas, we work on catching on potential risks in speech development very early on so that they can guide parents to use suitable strategies to support the child's speech development. When we understand the power of speech in child development and work with the child from a very early age, we can avoid many future difficulties. A well-communicating child will be a well-communicating adult."





Omama Vierka published the first book of Romani nursery rhymes

The first book of Romani nursery rhymes, Sunoro, written by omama Vierka from Zborov, was published in the autumn of 2021. In her work with the youngest children in Zborov, Vierka recognized that in addition to Slovak, those children needed to work on the development of their mother tongue. But where to find Romani nursery rhymes? She took it into her own hands.

Research shows that the better the child masters her primary language, the easier it is to learn the other ones. That is also why the children need to have the broadest possible vocabulary in their first language. The book of Romani rhymes helps to improve this.





Thanks to donations from 371 donors in a fundraising campaign at Startlab, 700 copies of the Sunoro book were published and delivered to all the omamas and families in the program.



Omamas improved their Slovak and worked on cognitive development

AMAL

For most omamas, Slovak is not their primary language. We noticed that they needed help in their reading, vocabulary, and writing in Slovak during regular training and supervision. Since reading a children's book with a child is a part of each lesson. omamas should be able to read the text correctly as well as understand it, interpret it engagingly for the child, and to show the child's mother the importance of reading for the development of imagination and vocabulary.

AMAL, the program for language support of omamas, evolved gradually. In its pilot phase in 2020, we worked with experts to develop educational materials, and we tailored the program to meet omamas' needs.

They attend a weekly group lecture and starting September 2021, volunteers (amals) also have individual conversational classes with omamas. They discuss various topics, listen, write, read, and talk. Because language is instrumental in understanding ourselves and the people and the world around us, their lessons also help build relationships and mutual understanding. All lessons were held online.

FIE

Feuerstein's Instrumental Enrichment (FIE) method stimulates cognitive development using worksheets like Point arrangement, Space orientation, or Analytical thinking. A lecturer in the role of an intermediary bridges the information learned during work with worksheets and helps students apply acquired strategies in real life. The whole process is run in a non-evaluating environment where everyone has their own pace and time to think and is free to participate according to their own needs. FIE method is used worldwide with children and adults with special needs and with gifted children. Nine mentors, supervisors, and coordinators in the Omama Program have completed FIE Standard or BASIC training. Beginning last year, we started using it during our mentoring sessions for omamas in Chminianske Jakubovany, Kecerovce, Raslavice, Rokycany and Huncovce.

For many of them, school was a traumatic experience. Until today, some of them feel anxious about being ridiculed or punished for their mistakes. Despite that, they still want to learn and catch up on what they missed. Mainly to help with the development of children participating in the Omama Program.





The FILIP Program

A new roof, own place to live, electricity, stable employment, driving license, or enough money to buy milk for the children. For a family living in generational poverty, goals like these may be very distant.

FILIP, a new program of Way Out, is about guiding families living in generational poverty towards their goals. The program started in 2021, but the idea was born much earlier. The program has been fully launched in four communities in cooperation with the National Bank of Slovakia and their project supporting financial literacy in various target groups.

In 2022, four mentors (FILIPs) will help 30 families in Veľká Lomnica, Zborov, Chminianske Jakubovany and Kecerovce. They will meet with the participating families weekly and firmly and kindly support them on their way out of poverty by advising them on navigating the network of institutions, documents, and rules.

Way Out in 2021

3 May We launch a crowdfunding campaign at Startlab, intending to publish the first book of Romani nursery rhymes, Sunoro, written by omama Viera Kováčová. Thanks to 371 donors, 700 copies of the book are distributed among families in the program, the donors, and institutions working with Roma children. 10 May Spring campaign "Rozbehni omamy" begins. 741 donors helped start the Omama Program in new communities by donating 22,000 EUR. 3 Exhibition of Martin Šveda's photos of 14 May omamas starts in Bratislava's Eurovea shopping center. First training of new omamas and 27 – 30 May mentors in Veľký Slavkov. May We are expanding our team of supervisors directly in regions. Expansion of the program into 5 new 1 June communities: Zvolen, Žiar nad Hronom, Jelšava, Košice (Luník IX) and Stráne pod Tatrami. 20 omamas in 16 communities help with the development of 369 children. Twelve mentors help them. 7 June Katka Koščová holds a concert for children in Zborov as part of a charity campaign during Biela Vrana (White

Crow) awards.


